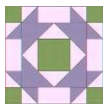

May: Nola Bohuslav has scheduled a trunk show with Leo9 Textiles from Smithville, Texas. The trunk show will be curved wedges and a large star.

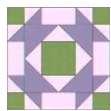

Janet's Junk

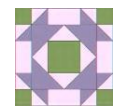

April – President appoints Chairman of the Nominating Committee

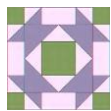
May – Slate of Officers is presented to the membership for discussion. President opens floor for additional nominations or volunteers.

July - Transitional meeting of outgoing and incoming officers

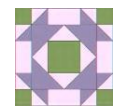
August – Appointment of installation chair; proposed budget presented to membership for discussion and other changes made in transitional meeting; publish proposed budget in newsletter.

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MINUTES OF THE APRIL 2, 2024, SHINER HERITAGE QUILTERS MEETING

On April 2, 2024, President Janet Ferguson called the meeting to order and welcomed the members of the Shiner Heritage Quilters. There were 33 members present, including new members, Tommie Clayton, Hope Cummins, and Margo Henderson.

Janet thanked the hostesses for the evening, Carol Daniel, Sarah Collins, Gladys Muehlstein, Marilyn Schroeder and Janet Ferguson.

Janet then presented the Meeting Minutes for the March 2024 meeting and asked if there were any corrections and there were none. Rosemary made a motion that the Minutes be approved, and Rae Nell seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously.

Rae Nell presented the Treasurer's Report for February and March 2024, and they will be filed for audit.

Toni Rogers then asked for Sunshine and Shadows and birthdays were celebrated.

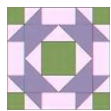
There was no program scheduled for the evening; the focus was on the success of the 2024 Spring into Quilting show and discussions regarding ways to improve the 2026 show.

Old Business:

Janet then asked for any of the members that had worked on the quilt show, whether they were on a particular committee or just showed up to give assistance as needed, from Sunday to assist in retrieving all the materials needed from the storage room or through the final takedown, also including assistance with retrieving the quilts from display and helping with delivery of quilts to their owners. As members stood up to be recognized, Janet pointed out that it takes all the members to make the show as successful as this one.

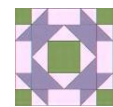
Janet then reviewed the income from the show, covering all the individual committees. She reported that the gross income received \$14,255.50 before all bills are paid.

Janet then opened a discussion about improvements and how smoothly everything was carried out. She also asked the committee heads to make a note of these items in your books and turn them into Linda. Linda also advised that she would be meeting with the committee heads to discuss suggestions and improvements that could be made for the 2026 show. Linda also



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thanked the committee members and said that she had so enjoyed taking on the position of the head chairman that she would gladly continue in that position as long as she was needed.

Janet indicated that the Guild had received an envelope from the Quilts of Honor ladies. The envelope contained five UPC labels for the purchase of Heirloom 80/20 batting in a 96" by 30yd of batting for \$80.00 or a 96" by 30yd of polyester batting for \$31.00. After discussion, Ray Nell made a motion that the Guild purchase a roll of Heirloom 80/20 batting. The motion was seconded by Dee and passed unanimously.

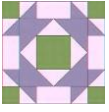
Janet then said that the Guild had received an invitation to join the Yoakum Heritage Museum. The theme for the Christmas tree Forest this year is "A Slice of Christmas History." After discussion, Irene Cerny made a motion that the Guild decline the offer and Rae Nell seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Janet next pointed out that it is time to establish an election committee to elect new officers. She asked if there was anyone who would be willing to volunteer to act as chair for the committee. She pointed out the chair could select any members to assist in the process and Darcy offered to head the committee. Janet told Darcy that she could select any members of the Guild to assist her. Janet also pointed out that because of the Covid virus all the current officers have fulfilled their eligibility for two or more consecutive terms and are not eligible to serve on the upcoming board.

Janet said that someone had asked the members would be willing to consider moving the meeting times back to 6:00pm for social hour and 6:30pm for meeting time. After a discussion, a motion was made by Carol Daniel that the meeting times would be changed to 5:30pm for social time and 6:00pm for meeting time. The motion was approved by a show of hands.

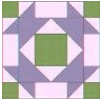
Janet then pointed out that it is time to start planning for the July dinner meeting and Janet asked if there was someone who would be willing to head the committee. During the discussion, Rae Nell said she would be glad to have her son prepare his barbecue dinner for the meeting. It was approved by a show of hands that the meal would be provided by Rae Nell Janik's son.

Janet said a discussion was brought up about having a bus trip since we did not have one this year because of the quilt show. In the group discussion, several people showed an interest in taking a bus trip to Missouri Star in Hamilton, Missouri. Janet said she had reached out to several bus companies regarding the cost of making such a trip. She learned that the trip would include a 16-18 hour trip at a cost of \$10,000.00 to \$12,000.00, and a hotel cost of \$100.00 to \$160.00.



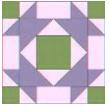
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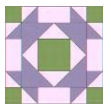
