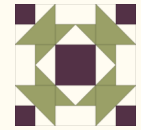

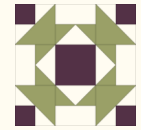

MINUTES OF THE JULY 1, 2025 SHINER HERITAGE QUILTERS MEETING

President Linda Parr called the meeting to order at 6:05 p.m. welcoming 39 members and 1 guest.

She thanked the hostesses: Darcy Curtin, Beth Blanchard, Peggy Moore and Margo Henderson.

Toni shared a poem entitled, "Quilting , from the husband of a quilter". Sunshine and Shadows were then shared, and our Quilt Show Countdown now stands at 227 days!

Karin gave the Treasurer's Report: Checking:	\$3,360.79
Savings:	\$11,218.50
Total:	\$14,579.29

Annette stated that she is accepting membership dues now through the September meeting and that they are \$25.00 per member.

There were no corrections to the minutes. Some members mentioned they did not receive the minutes. Darcy stated that she will check her email addresses to be certain all members are included on her newsletter mail out as it does contain the minutes. A motion was made by Charlene to approve the minutes and it was seconded by Margo. The motion carried.

There were no corrections to the newsletter.

Debbie had no correspondence to share.

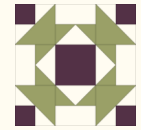
Sarah shared with the members that her daughter Madeline is working on a project to make 25 Veteran service dog kennel blankets. 7 quilts have already been made at the Square Quilter, 18 more are needed to reach her goal. She is accepting fabric in yardage and 6"x6" squares plus 26"x26" fabric for the backing. All is appreciated!

Rhonda informed the group that Fabric Friends in Victoria is collecting the Poppy Quilt Blocks and will be picking them up from the Square Quilter on August 13th when they will be taken to Kyle, Texas to be made into quilts for the Camp Mystic

families. This project will continue past this date and you may drop your completed 12 1/2" square blocks at the Square Quilter. The shop also has a pattern for the block.



Rae Nell said Kathy Riske gave 15 quilt tops and backings to be completed for the flood victims. All we need to supply is batting and our quilting time. Completion date is the middle of September. You may return your completed quilt to Rae Nell or drop it off at the Square Quilter. A picture was taken of the members taking packets to show our charity involvement.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

BLOCK OF THE MONTH: Margo handed out the next block and we have only one more block to go! A picture was taken of the completed blocks.

NORMA'S HOUSE: Laura sent an email to Linda reporting we have completed 50 quilts and need only 10 more to reach our goal. We received 7 more at this meeting, so only 3 more needed at this time.

NURSING HOME: Bernadette needed 10 more at the start of our meeting. She received 8 at the meeting so now needs only 2 more to complete our goal! She reminded everyone of our workday every 3rd Monday of the month at the Square Quilter beginning at 10:00 a.m.

QUILT SHOW COMMITTEES:

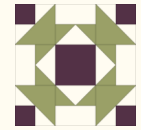

CHALLENGE BLOCK: Annette and Mary have chosen the fabric and handed out 30 packets to the members joining the challenge.

ENTRIES: Darcy informed the group that 4 quilts will now be allowed per member as we have more space in the K.C. Hall.

RAFFLE: Nola said she and Wilma are now collecting items for the 10 baskets they are hoping to make. Whatever you wish to donate can be added to a basket with other items other members have donated.

VENDORS: We now have 12 vendors. Brenda informed us that she is hoping to get 24. If anyone knows of someone that is interested in having a booth, please let her know.

Karin and Darcy presented a very informative power point presentation on the proposed budget for September 2025-August 2026 which will be voted on at our September meeting. Questions were asked and answered. No questions concerning the budget will be allowed at the September meeting. Only the voting on the proposed budget will take place. 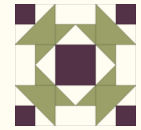

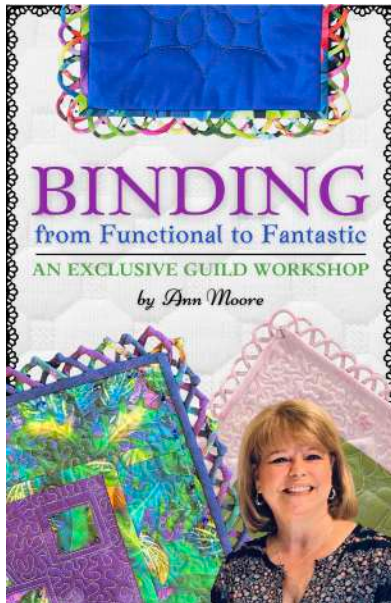
GUILD SEW DAYS • EVERY THIRD MONDAY

Until the Quilt Show next March, The Square Quilter is opening its doors just for us every third Monday, from 10:00 am until.... The primary focus is to work on items for the Boutique for the Quilt Show but it's also okay to work on your own personal projects. Bring your own machine and tools.

Here is a list of the remaining third Mondays: Monday, August 18 - Monday, September 15 - Monday, October 20 - Monday, November 17 - Monday, December 15 - Monday, January 19 - Monday - February 16 - Monday, March 16

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 2 • TRUNK SHOW • ANN MOORE

Ann Moore is a national quilting instructor and designer for Sew Steady/Westalee instructor who incorporates free motion and ruler work into her quilts and classes. She has won numerous awards, and does all her quilting on domestic machines.



Ann will present a Trunk Show of her work during our regular meeting time. We also have TWO full-day workshops with Ann! You do not have to take both classes.

In an earlier newsletter, we stated that if you do take both classes you will use the block that you quilt on day one for the binding class on day two, but after speaking with Ann, she has discovered that this does not leave enough time for students to finish the binding on day two, so she will provide prepared kits for day two. The guild covers the cost of the kits for both days.

**TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 2 • ALL-DAY WORKSHOP (10:00 - 5:00) • ANN MOORE
• INTRODUCTION TO RULER WORK • \$45 FOR MEMBERS**

Learn how to use rulers and template to create beautiful quilting patterns with your domestic sewing machine. Ann provides gliders, rulers and templates AS LOANERS for the class. She will have these items for sale as well. Ann will provide a prepared quilt sandwich.

Supply List:

- **Sewing Machine** in good working order. Bring your manual if you have it. We will lower the feed dogs so make sure your machine has this capability.
- **Thread**
- **90/14 or 80/12 machine needles**, topstitch preferred
- **Ruler foot** if you have one. Ann will have some for sale but will not have the Bernina shank.
- **Fabric marking tools**. Ann uses chacoliners or wash away pens.
- **Cutting ruler** at least 18 inches long for marking borders
- **Quilting gloves** optional
- **Flat quilting surface such as a Sew Steady table**. Bring your machine extension table if you do not have a Sew Steady table.



The Tuesday class meets in the Fellowship Hall (our regular meeting room). We will start at 10:00 am. Plan to arrive at 9:30 am to get set up. Please do not come earlier than 9:30 so we do not interrupt the Men's Prayer Breakfast. Bring a lunch or plan to go out during the day. We will have the room open until the meeting.

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 3 • ALL-DAY WORKSHOP (9:00 - 6:00) • ANN MOORE • CORDED BINDING • \$55 FOR MEMBERS

Learn how to create intricate and unusual corded bindings for your quilts. Ann will provide kits, including fabric, glue, thread and yarn, paid for by the guild.

Supply List:

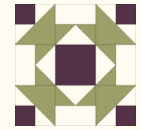
- **Sewing Machine** in good working order.
- **Zipper foot** (regular, not invisible)
- **¼ inch foot** or all purpose foot without flange
- **Small iron and small ironing mat**
- **Rotary cutter, cutting mat, and cutting ruler 12 - 18 inches long**
- **Marking chalk or pencil** (wash away pens NOT recommended)
- **Starch**
- **Hand sewing needles and pins**

The Wednesday class meets in the Activity Center (the gym behind the church). We will start at 9:00 am. Plan to arrive at 8:30 am to get set up. Bring a lunch or plan to go out during the day.

Remember this fascinating quilt Debbie showed us back in February?

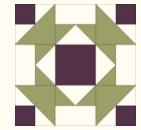
At the November meeting, we will learn a bit of history behind the technique and how to make these interesting folded log cabin blocks.

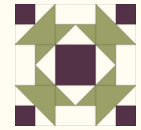

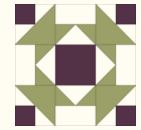

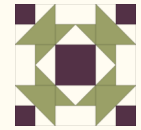
